

Proposal

In your proposal you will have to:

- I. Give a title (feel free to be creative, but also don't miss the point).
- II. Write an abstract of 300-350 words about what your essay is about.
- III. Write a literature review of around 2000 (or more) words. In this part you will have to explain what two or three of your secondary sources are about.
- IV. Write down your suggested references. Your references should include your primary source(s) (that is the original texts that you are planning to analyze) and at least 10 secondary sources (articles, books, collections of articles, reviews etc. related to the subject you have chosen).

IMPORTANT NOTES:

For your citations and references you will use the MLA style. Therefore, you would be advised to find the *MLA Handbook* (7th or 8th edition).

You can find material for your essay in libraries. You can also find material on-line. Try to be selective and choose material from reliable and scientific sources.

If you have a laptop, you can bring it to the university and connect to JSTOR. If you can't do it, you can go to room 72 of the main building. It's a computer lab and you are free to use the computers. In order to connect to JSTOR, go to the official webpage of the university: ankara.edu.tr Then click "Library", then "Library and Documentation Department", then "Research", then "Online databases" and then scroll down until you find JSTOR.

You can also use google to find "open access journals".

These are recommended options but not the only ones.

Plagiarism will not be tolerated.

Be positive. Try to see this as a good opportunity to write/read/think about something interesting.
