CHARACTERS

The King Lovell, courtier

Sir Hugh Lacy, Earl of Lincoln Rowland Lacy, otherwise Hans/ Askew- nephew of Sir Hugh Lacy, Earl of Lincoln Dodger, servant to Earl of Lincoln (parasite)

Sir Roger Oteley, Lord Major of London Rose, daughter of Sir Roger Oteley, Lord Major of London Sybil-Rose's maid Master Scott- Rose's cousin

Master Warner-Citizen of London, brother in law of Master Hammond Master Hammond-Citizen of London, (first seeks Rose and when she refuses pursues Jane, Ralph's wife)

Simon Eyre, the shoemaker

Margery, wife of Simon Eyre, the shoemaker Hodge, Fink, Ralph- Simon Eyre's journeymen Jane (Ralph's wife) The Shoemaker's Holiday as a (London) City Comedy

- 2. The comedy gives insight into the economic and social milieu of London during the years 1598-1600
- 3. It portrays the ordinary life in London and celebrates the lives of ordinary citizens (and their language).
