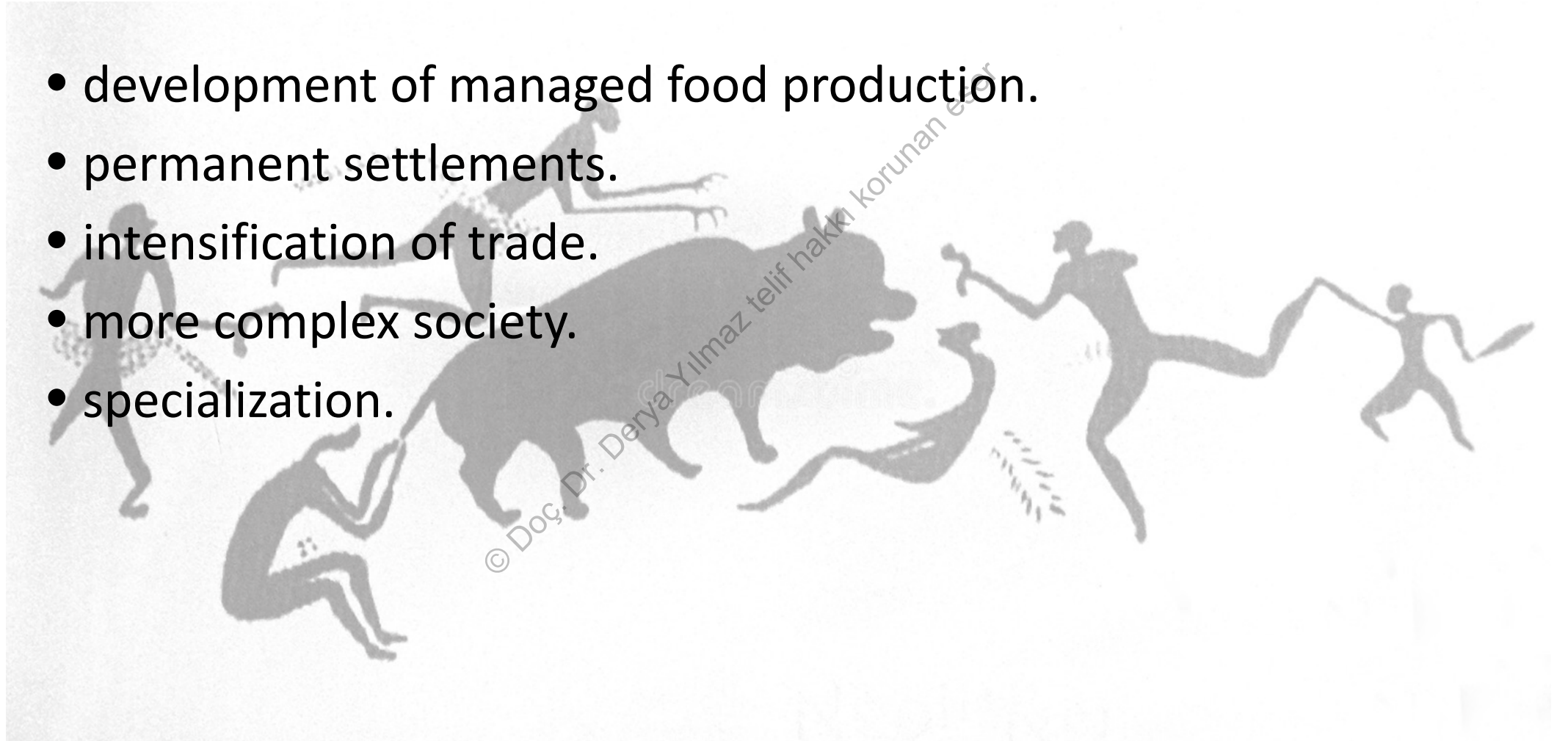
Terminology

- **Chalcolithic** : the period of transition from stone to metal using industries.
- **Cist** : a box made of stone slabs.
- **Megalith** : literally big stone from the Greek megas meaning great and lithos, stone.
- **Neolithic**: the 'New Stone Age' - between about 13000 and 5000 BC in Anatolia. This period saw the development of agriculture, pottery, polished stone axes and megalithic structures. It is sub-divided into the early, middle and late Neolithic followed by the transitional Chalcolithic period passing into the Bronze Age.

- **Orthostat:** Any upright stone but often used to refer to the erect sideslabs used in a megalithic structure.
- **Stele:** a carved standing stone.

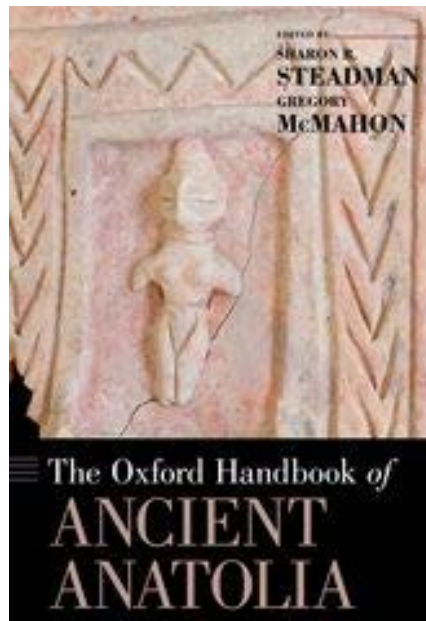
What are 5 characteristics of the Neolithic Age ?

- specialization.

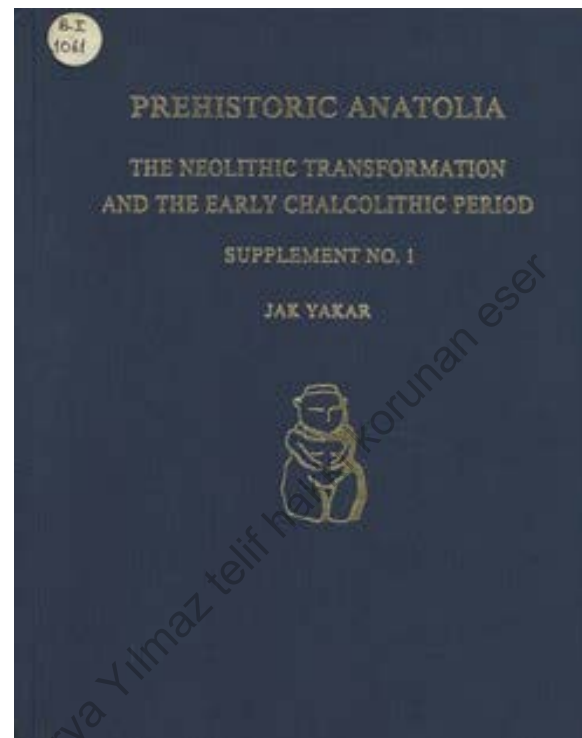


Çatal Höyük wall painting: Hunting scene.

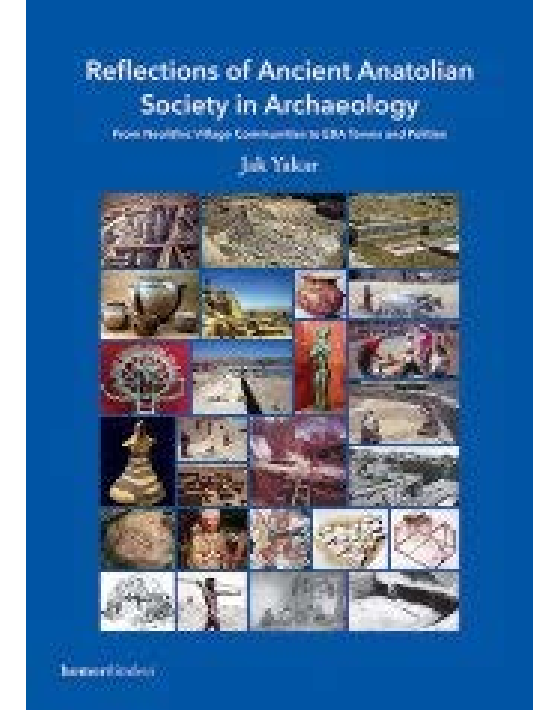
