







#### HISTORY OF DOMESTICATION

- Who is the ancestor of dogs?
  - Gray wolf and dog Relatives
  - Common ancestor of wolf and dog: Taimyr wolf
  - About 30,000 years ago, the wolf and dog separated from each other. (Freedman et.al. 2014).









#### **Domestication Theories**

#### • Ice Age:

Starving wolves began to scavenge around human resources



- Old theory Human influence:
- Man noticed wolves...
- However:
  - People did not tolerate carnivorous competitors at that time
  - Wolf hunting is the indicator of power until recently
  - Probably friendly wolves approached and were tolerated by humans
  - Result: Wolves started the domestication process!






#### How difficult can domestication be?

- Dmitry K. Belyaev managed to turn silver foxes into dogs after 40 generations (1959-).
- From the 6th generation on, dog-like reactions have started to be observed.
- All of the genetic changes were to socialize with humans.

- They depend on people and human resources to survive!








# Integration ability of urban free ranging dogs into humans' life

- How much can two different species understand each other?








#### Dogs' ability to understand humans



#### Results of the study

- When the dog and the child are together:
- Dog's emotional state?
- The dog's behavior?
- Why?



- Expert panel:
- Behaviors associated with anxiety / fear / emotional conflict
- Most of the participants (68.4%): Dogs are relaxed and happy
- Dominant behavior: Play behavior and friendly behavior

- If at home: Guilty






#### Why are we making mistakes?

# BASIC ERRORS IN COMMUNICATION Why do dogs bite?

- If he cannot communicate by talking
- (except redirected aggression, learned context, and no pathological problem)
- Education is essential to prevent biting cases!
- Education:
- Teaching the correct communication with dogs
- Teaching the warning signs
- Choosing the right strategy in case of any attack


