The next large city to be favored in this regard is San Francisco, where through private benefaction funds have already been provided and plans about completed for the erection of a splendid public aquarium to be located in Golden Gate Park and operated at municipal expense under the immediate supervision of the California Academy of Sciences.

Chimelong Ocean Kingdom

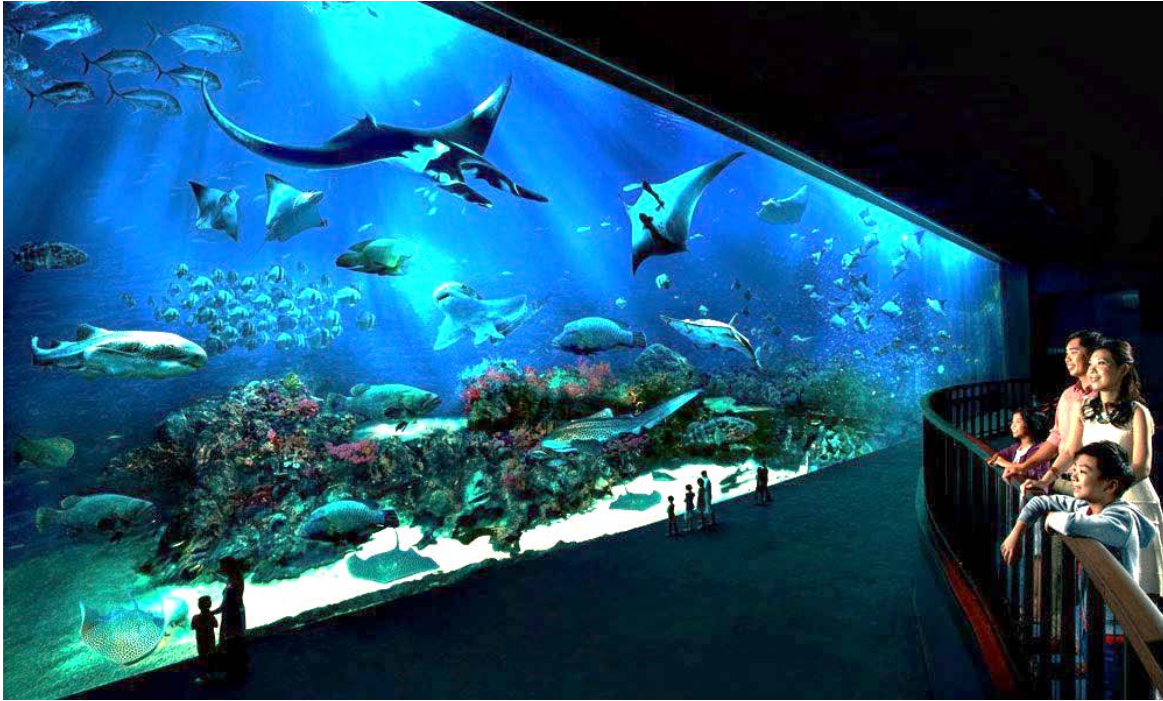
Total Water Volume: 48.8 million liters (12.9 million gallons)
