- Is the male body objectified? Yes/no and to what extent?

Fifth Clip (New complications and problems)

- Is there any form of punishment?
- Are Thelma and Louise active or passive characters?
- What kind of problems does their active/passive status create?

Sixth Clip (Thelma and Louise against a truck driver)

- Is this revenge?
- What is the statement here?

Seventh Clip (The end)

- Was the end expected? Is it positive or negative?
- How do you feel about the last shot of the film?

General Questions

- Is Thelma & Louise a feminist film? And what does this mean?
- Does it challenge well established notions on the male/female binary opposition?
- What kind of ending would you have preferred and why?
