Universities

- Harvard (1636)
- ► Yale (1701)
- Columbia (1754)

And some of the oldest Universities in Europe:

- University of Bologna (1158)
- University of Oxford (1167)
- University of Salamanca (1218)

- At least 1 university/state
- 5000 people have graduated from Harvard (around 350-400 students)
- In 1820, 1406 out of 8000 graduates were clergymen
- Less attention is paid to classical studies
- More practice, less theory
- Medicine is almost as good as in Europe.

Newspapers/journals

- 600-1000 journals
- In New York and Pennsylvania 200 journals for 3 m population
- (3.9 m in 1790, 5.3 m in 1800, 7.2 m in 1810, 9.6, in 1820, 12.9 m in 1830, 17 m in 1840 and 23.2 m in 1850)
- Sometimes journals were... one man show
- Focus on facts
- Press is more decent than in England
- An editor can even bring a criminal charge to the president
- However, they print the proceedings of the courts (Cooper complains)

Literature

- Before 1776 English authors are considered common property
- There are not a lot American authors because of two obstacles
- Printing English books is cheaper
- II. "There is scarcely an ore which contributes to the wealth of the author..."
- A couple of French translations
- Some authors printed in England
- Poets focus on nature

Theatre

- Variety of theatres
- Well-paid actors
- Better quality than in England for two reasons:
- I. People don't like caricatures
- II. Small number of theatres guarantees quality
- There are no dramatic authors (playwrights)
