



The Conscious and the Unconscious

- Genital (puberty-)


Oedipus Complex (phallic stage)






Fear of castration


Examples of unresolved Oedipus complex in relationships








Dreams

- Manifest content
- Latent content
- Displacement and condensation

An example

"A house was on fire. My father was standing beside my bed and woke me up. I dressed quickly. Mother wanted to stop and save her jewel-case, but father said 'I refuse to let myself and my two children be burnt for the sake of your jewel-case.' We hurried downstairs, and as soon as I was outside I woke up."

Is there a solution?

- Free association
- Interpretation of dreams
- Anxiety is a manifestation of unresolved issues from the past (some core issues are: fear of intimacy, fear of abandonment, fear of betrayal, low self-esteem and... the Oedipus complex)



"It feels like people are always trying to avoid me."

What do Freudian critics do?

- They see art as a dream (manifest content and latent content)
- They "psychoanalyze" the author
- They "psychoanalyze" the characters

Objections/Problems?

- Too many speculations and (almost) no proof
- Freud is considered to be outdated
- Too much emphasis on the penis
- He basically focused on men
- His theories are frequently accused of sexism
- Nevertheless Freud is always a point of reference
